Following the positive reception of Suzuki's first motorcycle, the "Power Free" (36cc) in 1952, an upgraded version with a 60cc engine was released in 1953. It still featured a 2-stroke air-cooled single-cylinder engine, double sprocket wheels, and a wet multi-plate clutch with a 2-speed transmission. In the inaugural Mt. Fuji Hill Climb race in 1953, it won the motorcycle motor section, and it also successfully completed the "Japan Cross Test," a journey of approximately 3,000km from Sapporo to Kagoshima. These achievements demonstrated its performance even under harsh conditions.

The Suzuki "Hayabusa" was introduced in 1998 and was subsequently launched in Europe and North America the following year. Its highperformance capabilities and aerodynamic styling garnered attention, making it Suzuki's flagship motorcycle. In 2007, the second generation was released, further increasing its popularity worldwide. In 2021, the third generation was introduced, incorporating advanced electronic controls. The exhibited vehicle is a special edition released in 2023 to commemorate the 25th anniversary, featuring a unique orange-themed body color and special emblems.
