The instrument panel featured a woodgrain-finished cluster of seven meters.

In the 1960s, as a precursor to the coming motorization era, various companies released passenger cars with designs by renowned foreign designers to enhance their corporate image. Hino entrusted Italian designer Giovanni Michelotti to design a prototype based on the Hino Contessa 900. The beautiful styling of the prototype garnered attention at international motor shows around the world, as well as at the 10th All Japan Automobile Show. The car featured a unique engine with a displacement of 893cc and 50ps, making it one-of-a-kind in the world.

During that time, it was the first front-engine, front-wheel-drive vehicle in Japan as a cab-over type vehicle. Taking advantage of its low-floor design, it offered a wide range of variations for business and leisure purposes, from light vans for business use to 11-seater minibuses. The production period was from February 1960 to October 1962, with a total production of 2,344 units. It featured an 836cc engine with 28ps. It is a rare vehicle that still exists today.
